Round 3 now open for applications

Funding is available to farmers and land managers in parts of the River Tone, Parrett and Yeo catchments for adopting practices that reduce phosphorus inputs to farmland, prevent soil erosion and buffer watercourses from run-off.

Fixed rate payments for:

- Fencing to exclude livestock from watercourses.
- Grassland subsoiling.
- Undersowing grass into maize.
- Growing cover crops after maize.
- Growing cover crops after combinable crops.
- Establishing new or wider arable buffer strips.
- Arable reversion to zero-input grass.
- Arable reversion to low/medium-input grass.
- Arable reversion to legume fallow.
- Arable reversion to herbal ley.
- Cross-slope hedgerow creation.

Increased payment rates for new 6m arable buffer strips alongside watercourses and ditches
